Collaboration with NGOs to tackle the SDGs

NIDE-HPF Collaboration for the CDIC Project

- The National Institute of Diabetes and Endocrinology (NIDE), DUHS, partnered with the Health Promotion Foundation (HPF) by signing a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) on 16th April 2025.
- The MoU was signed under the leadership of Prof. Mohammed Saeed Quraishy, T.I., Meritorious Professor & Vice Chancellor, DUHS, and Prof. Jahan Ara Hasan, Meritorious Professor & Pro Vice Chancellor, DUHS.
- The agreement was formalized by Prof. Abdul Basit (HPF) and Dr. Ashar Afaq, Registrar, DUHS.
- The CDIC clinic at NIDE was inaugurated, offering free insulin, glucometers, and strips to all registered children with type 1 diabetes.
- The Changing Diabetes in Children (CDIC) project is a global initiative led with Novo Nordisk and Roche, currently active in 18 countries. In Pakistan, 26 centers are already functioning, with NIDE becoming the 27th center.
- Dr. Musarrat Riaz, Director of NIDE, emphasized the program's importance in improving quality of life for children with type 1 diabetes.



Dedicated Courses Advancing Sustainability and SDGs

DUHS demonstrates commitment to SDG-focused education by offering dedicated courses and electives addressing sustainability and the SDGs across multiple programs. 

Intercontinental Tri-Partite Telerobotic

DUHS, through visiting faculty Prof. Asif Chaudry, participated in the world's first Intercontinental Tri-Partite Telerobotic Surgery on 24 July, 2025, in collaboration with CUHK Medicine (Hong Kong), Renji Hospital Shanghai (China), and Imperial College London (UK). Surgeons in London and Shanghai operated simultaneously on a patient in Hong Kong, bridging 20,000 km with just an 80-millisecond latency.

This milestone directly aligns with SDG Goal 17 (Partnerships for the Goals), as it highlights the power of international collaboration in advancing healthcare innovation.

The achievement demonstrates how knowledge-sharing and global partnerships geographical overcome limitations medical science. DUHS's involvement places Pakistan at the forefront of a groundbreaking medical



milestone, strengthening its visibility in global health networks.

The initiative also shows how partnerships can accelerate the adoption of cutting-edge technologies in developing countries, fostering collective progress toward better healthcare access and innovation. This collaboration serves as a model for future joint ventures, proving that partnerships are essential for achieving shared goals and advancing global well-being.

PNRA Workshop at Dow Institute of Radiology

Dow Institute of Radiology, DUHS, hosted the PNRA Workshop on Nuclear Safety and Radiological Sciences, bringing together experts, faculty, and healthcare professionals for an in-depth exchange on best practices and innovation in radiology on 31 December, 2024. The sessions emphasized radiation safety, diagnostic accuracy, and the integration of global knowledge into local healthcare systems.

This workshop highlighted the importance of collaborative learning where professionals from diverse backgrounds came together to enhance their understanding of nuclear and radiological sciences. It not only improved participants' professional capacity but also created lasting connections between institutions and experts.

Advanced Emergency Bootcamp at DUHS

On December 30, 2024, DUHS, in collaboration with IPPA, CHALO, and PSEM, organized the Advanced Emergency Bootcamp at Ojha Campus. Under the leadership of Prof. Mohammed Saeed Quraishy and international experts, the program trained healthcare professionals in lifesaving emergency medicine techniques through simulations and hands-on practice.

The bootcamp represented DUHS's commitment to saving lives by preparing healthcare providers to respond effectively during critical emergencies.

The training directly advanced SDG 3 by building emergency response capacity in Pakistan's healthcare system. The collaboration with local and reflected international partners SDG showcasing 17. how partnerships can strengthen medical education and practice.



CME Workshop: Separated Instrument Removal in Dentistry

On May 27, 2025, Dow Dental College organized a CME-accredited workshop on separated instrument removal in dentistry, led by Prof. Dr. Arshad Hasan with cofacilitators Dr. Javeria Ali Khan and Dr. Samia Ali. Participants gained hands-on exposure to advanced endodontic techniques, enhancing their diagnostic and procedural expertise in dental practice. Such training ensures that dentists remain updated with global standards of care.

Furthermore, the collaborative nature of the program, with facilitators and participants sharing expertise, reflects SDG 17 (Partnerships) in advancing clinical knowledge. Collectively, this initiative enhances both academic growth and practical competence, leading to stronger healthcare delivery systems.

MoU with Augaf Department, Government of Sindh

On January 10, 2025, DUHS signed an MoU with the Auqaf & Religious Affairs Department, Government of Sindh. Through this collaboration, funds were allocated

for providing free OPD consultations, laboratory investigations, emergency care, and inpatient services to underprivileged patients. The initiative reflects DUHS's ongoing commitment to community health and social welfare.



This MoU aligns directly with SDG 3 (Good Health and Well-being) by expanding access to essential healthcare services for marginalized populations who otherwise face financial barriers. By ensuring that no patient is denied treatment due to inability to pay, the initiative promotes equity and inclusivity in healthcare, contributing to a healthier society.

Voluntary Blood Donation Camp

On January 11, 2025, the DUHS Blood Center, in collaboration with the Relay Foundation, organized a voluntary blood donation camp. Students, faculty, staff, and volunteers actively participated, ensuring a safe and sufficient blood supply for critical patients. CME Programs at DIPMR

programs focusing on neurological assessment. neurodevelopmental treatments (NDTs), and rehabilitation. cardiac Postgraduate students and faculty demonstrated rehabilitation advanced techniques, combining theory with practical applications to improve patient outcomes.
